Andrews to golf at Cleveland State

Gilmour Academy senior Alex Andrews, of Kirtland, signed a national letter of intent Monday to play golf at Cleveland State University.

Andrews, the Division III state medalist in 2009 and 2010, is one of 15 golfers in state history to win more than one state title.

He said he decided on CSU because it is a competitive golf team and is close to home. He also said he likes CSU golf coach Steven Weir and his "drive to win."

Andrews said his goal is to make it to the Nationwide Tour after he graduates from college. He plans to study business at CSU.

Andrews made first-team All-Ohio in 2008, 2009 and 2010 and holds two state records, including low score of 146 on the Ohio State University scarlet course in 2009 and low score of 145 on the North Star Golf Course in 2010.

He is ranked as the No. 1 boys' junior golfer in Ohio according to one rating service.

"Golf is an individual sport that in high school and college is played on a team," Gilmour head coach Charlie Tremont said. "Alex recognizes that you play for your teammates and when the team is successful, the individual success will follow. CSU is truly adding a team player and leader to their golf team roster."

In this year's Division III state championship in Sunbury, Andrews shot a 72 in the first round and a 73 in the second, earning him co-medalist honors with Ryan Troyer, of Sugarcreek Garaway. Andrews also won a Division III sectional title this year. In 2009, he won both sectional and district tournaments, then finished the season with two-round scores of 73 in order to earn state medalist honors.

Senior Nicki Henry, of Kenston, signed a national letter of intent Tuesday to play golf at Eastern Kentucky University in Richmond.

Henry finished fifth in Ohio and was named first-

team All-Ohio this season. She also was first-team all-district, first-team All-Chagrin Valley Conference for four years, CVC most valuable player and Academic All-Ohio and CVC All-Academic.

In 2009, she was 10th in the state and earned All-Ohio, first-team all-district, first-team all-league and conference most valuable player. In 2008, she was second-team all-district.

Winthrop lands spiker Landsman

Kenston senior Lauren Landsman signed a national letter of intent Tuesday to play volleyball at Winthrop University in Rockhill, S.C.

She was third-team All-Ohio this season and first-team All-Chagrin Valley Conference and first-team all-district. She was a conference all-academic.
