BOYS GOLFER OF THE YEAR

Alex Andrews

Senior, Gilmour

It was another banner season for Andrews, who was named The News-Herald's boys golfer of the year for a second straight year. He averaged 37.3 strokes for nine holes this year, including a season-best of 32. There's no shot on the course this young man can't make, and his work ethic in the off-season is second to none. The hard work paid off this year when he shot a medalist round of 145 at the Division III state tournament, shooting a 72 on the first day and a 73 on the second day. With the help of his stellar score, the Lancers were able to easily win the Division III state championship, carding a 634 — 22 strokes better than second-place Toledo Ottawa Hills. By winning medalist honors, Andrews joined exclusive company with Jack Nicklaus, Ben Curtis and a handful of others who won multiple state titles. He was medalist of the Division III state tournament as a junior as well.
